Message from our Supreme Chaplain

Dear Columbiettes:

When is enough, enough? How many more innocent children have to be martyred before we take the blinders off and heed the call to action!

Twenty-one additional families have to live with the profound sense of loss of life of those they have loved. Nineteen innocent school-age children and two teachers massacred by a depraved 18-year-old, who was legally allowed to purchase two automatic rifles that are used for war not hunting or innocent self-defense. How can the people that we have elected to lead us to remain silent? By their silence they demonstrate complicity!

Does a senator or congressperson have to have his or her son or daughter murdered before they have the guts to stand up for justice and speak out for common sense gun safety? This is not about denying any American citizen his or her second amendment rights, but it's about ensuring the safety of all American citizens, no matter what their age.

When will those who lead us have the guts to lead and not be bought off by the gun lobby, the insurance lobby or any other special interest groups that do not care about the life and safety of ordinary Americans?

Many in power are not doing their jobs on both sides of the aisle. They need to be voted out of office this election cycle. The silent majority needs to stand up and be counted and act in behalf of the innocent.

Schools were always a safe place for children to grow, learn and have fun. Another student body of more than 600 students has been traumatized. How long will it take for them to move beyond their fears. For some they will carry this trauma for the rest of their lives and it will impact their journey forever. Other students will have a chance to recover, but it will be a hard road especially since this poor Texan community does not have the trained mental health professionals to assist the students and their families. Will government

step- in? Who knows, it seems rather clear by all the school shootings in the past 10 years that the government and our leadership does not care!

You are the church! When are we going to stand up and be church and be counted! We preach forgiveness, but we support hate. We teach love but live with and encourage intolerance. We say that all are welcome but we practice exclusion.

As church we need to build bridges and not walls. We need to live compassion and forgiveness without exception. Our Holy Father, Pope Francis reminds us regularly that God loves everyone without exception and we need to do the same.

Our children are our greatest gift. May they never experience the trauma of Sandy Hook or Robb elementary school. May we have the courage to move beyond our deafness, our children are counting on us!







Message from our States


California-

LET'S LEARN

Ah, the lazy, hazy, crazy days of summer are here! Elections are over and all Columbiettes are looking forward to enjoying the season. Now, however, is the perfect time to begin transitioning and organizing for the upcoming Columbian year.

Officers, who are stepping down, are to turn over books, manuals, jewels, and records to the newly elected Officers. All Officers, the outgoing and incoming, should meet to discuss what is required in each Office. Sharing ideas as well as what was learned while holding Office will improve each Office and the Organization.

Hold a Reorganization Meeting. Review the By-laws to ensure they are up to date and all provisions are followed. It is also a perfect time to set goals for the upcoming year and plan a tentative calendar of events and activities. Include important due dates, projects, hospitality, etc. This will assist in having a productive first meeting and help in smoothly running the new year. Standing and Special Committee Chairs should be appointed.

Prior to the start of the new year, the President is to call for an audit of the financial records. The Immediate Past President is the Audit Committee Chair serving with two members in good standing, who are appointed by the President. After the audit is completed, the books and records are to be turned over to the new Treasurer and Financial Secretary.

Also, this is the time to transfer the power of authority to sign checks. Review the By-laws on who has the authority. It is usually the President and the Treasurer. Check with the financial institution on what is required to change the signing authority and be sure the transfer is completed before the first meeting of the new Columbian year.

Keep in contact with your members! Consider sending a summertime newsletter/e-mail reminding them of the date of the September meeting and how the Officers are looking forward to seeing them in the new year. Keeping all informed keeps all involved.



- ✓ **Newly Elected Financial Secretaries** are to send a notice to supremecomputerhelp@columbiettes.com informing the Supreme Office she is the new Financial Secretary for Auxiliary/Chapter/State and provide a password for access to the Supreme website.
- ✓ **Auxiliary Financial Secretaries** need to update the Auxiliary Membership list online to be sure all information is correct. Remember, the Auxiliary's per capita tax is based upon total membership as recorded on the Supreme list of members.
- ✓ **Treasurers** on all levels are to reconcile their checkbooks with their monthly bank statements and consult with the Financial Secretary to ensure all records agree.
- ✓ **Financial Secretaries** on all levels are to update their Officer information for Year 2022-2023 on the Supreme Website between July 1 to July 31. Chapters and Auxiliaries are to update information for each Officer as well as each Delegate and Alternate to State and Chapter. Include e-mail addresses.
- ✓ **Presidents** should be sure their By-laws are up to date and are followed.
- ✓ **Presidents** are to ensure the Auxiliary is compliant with the IRS. Check when the filing is due and file Form 990-N to the IRS.
- ✓ **Sentinels** are to set up the meeting chamber prior to the start of a meeting or ceremony and examine all attendees' travel cards for validity. Be sure the newly issued Auxiliary Meeting Room Set-up is followed.
- ✓ **Presidents and Financial Secretaries** are to be sure their Administration Manuals are up to date. The Manual is a valuable tool for information and reference.



As you have read in our prior newsletters, this is an ONGOING article and, in this edition, we are up to Part 4. Retention should be an ONGOING PROGRAM.

To recap from Part 3 - An important part of the Membership program for any Auxiliary is RETENTION. Members on this Committee should be conscientious and active, know the members well, and be dedicated to the preservation of the membership. If a member has missed a few meetings, they should call her. Sometimes their absence is due to lack of transportation. There is a saying that goes: "A member can miss one meeting for a good reason, the second meeting she misses is for no apparent reason and the third meeting she doesn't care or miss her group at all". Do not let this happen to your members. Let them know they are missed.

In the past articles we have mentioned Attendance pools and Carpools. Set up your own Columbiette "Uber" group for members who don't want to go out alone or don't drive anymore. Maybe there are drivers who would welcome having a copilot to drive along with them to the meeting. Hold activities after each, or every other meeting such as a Potluck Lunch or Dinner, or a dessert party.

I recently heard of an auxiliary raffling off Gas Gift Cards and Grocery Store Gift Cards, to members in attendance. All they must do is SHOW UP for a meeting and you're entered to win!

Last week, I heard a wonderful idea from Manresa Columbiettes in Staten Island. In addition to an Attendance pool, they go to **local** restaurants/stores that are independently owned by members of their community and purchase Gift certificates (say \$25.00 each) and raffle them off to the members in attendance. This has increased their membership at many meetings by 25 to 35 percent **and** it helps the community as well. Isn't this a GREAT idea to increase membership **and** to help the small, locally owned restaurants and stores in their community who are struggling from the effects of this pandemic? I'm sure each of you can come up with a WIN – WIN event such as this. When you do, we would love to hear about it! Send your ideas to Office@Columbiettes.com and ask them to forward them to me.

So, with the SUMMER COMING, put your *Thinking Caps* on and start planning your Retention Projects and remember, Retention is also a part of the MMJM Award process.

Blessed Angeline of Marsciano's Story

Blessed Angeline founded the first community of Franciscan women other than Poor Clares to receive papal approval.

Angeline was born to the Duke of Marsciano near Orvieto. She was 12 when her mother died. Three years later, the young woman made a vow of perpetual chastity. That same year, however, she yielded to her father's decision that she marry the Duke of Civitella. Her husband agreed to respect her previous vow.

When he died two years later, Angeline joined the Secular Franciscans and with several other women dedicated herself to caring for the sick, the poor, widows and orphans. When many other young women were attracted to Angeline's community, some people accused her of condemning the married vocation. Legend has it that when she came before the King of Naples to answer these charges, she had burning coals hidden in the folds of her cloak. When she proclaimed her innocence and showed the king that these coals had not harmed her, he dropped the case.

Angeline and her companions later went to Foligno, where her community of Third Order sisters received papal approval in 1397. She soon established 15 similar communities of women in other Italian cities.

Angeline died on July 14, 1435, and was beatified in 1825. Her liturgical feast is celebrated on July 13.

Reflection

Priests, sisters, and brothers cannot be signs of God's love for the human family if they belittle the vocation of marriage. Angeline respected marriage but felt called to another way of living out the gospel. Her choice was life-giving in its own way.




